Five Master Gardeners homes were selected each with a different educational theme. The garden in Sand Springs featured raised bed vegetable gardening, featuring 'companion plantings' to minimize pesticide sprays. Visitors were shown different methods to fight off garden pests. One garden on South Atlanta featured containers and turf. How to incorporate containers into your landscape and how to properly plant a container were shown at this location. A Midtown Tulsa home featured shade gardening, cottage style gardening and seemed to be one of the favorites on the garden tour. Water gardening was featured at home on 47th place. This home featured a 2400 gallon pond with a water fall. Also featured was a home that is a certified wildlife habitat home. At this home visitors were taught how to attract butterflies and birds to their landscapes. The last garden on the tour was the Tulsa County Extension Office. Master Gardeners were available at every location to help answer any questions.
